Release and Waiver of Liability: I hereby agree, both on my behalf individually as a parent and behalf individually as a parent and on behalf of my child, to hereby release and to indemnify and hold harmless Saint Joseph Notre Dame High School, its agents, officers, directors, employees, and any other organization co-sponsoring the program or activities, from and against any and all injuries or damages which I or my child may suffer for any claims of negligence or alleged negligent act(s) or omission(s) arising out of or in any way connected with my or my child's participation in the program, event(s) or any activities related thereto. **I have read this paragraph and understand and agree that this is a Release and Waiver of claims both on behalf of myself and my child and that I am relinquishing rights by signing this agreement and have done so voluntarily.**

Any dispute between the parties arising out of this agreement shall be submitted to binding arbitration before a retired judge in Alameda County under the arbitration provisions of the California Code of Civil Procedure. This arbitrator shall be selected by mutual agreement, or if that is not possible shall select this arbitrator, by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court. Each party shall bear their own costs and expenses of the arbitration and an equal share of the arbitrator's fees. Any arbitration shall be subject to the same statutes of limitations as would apply in the absence of an arbitration provision. **The parties irrevocably waive the right to a court or jury trial.**

SPORTSMANSHIP CODE

Saint Joseph Notre Dame High School, a member of the Tri County Athletic League requires that all athletic contests played under its jurisdiction be exhibitions of sportsmanlike and ethical behavior. All contests must be safe and orderly. Athletes, coaches, game officials, parents and spectators must demonstrate courteous and controlled actions. Conduct of athletes and coaches comes under the immediate jurisdiction of game officials. Any disruptive behavior of parents and or spectators, such as yelling at officials and taunting opponents, could result in removal from the premises and/or forfeiture of the contest. Complete cooperation with school and game officials by student and adult spectators is expected. Athletic contests should be enjoyable experiences for athletes, coaches, and spectators.

EXPECTATIONS OF COACHES, ATHLETES AND PARENTS

Attention is given to sportsmanlike and ethical behavior because the TCAL and SJND are making this a priority for the safety of our players and spectators, and because the example of professional and college sports is not the standard to follow.

Instances when game officials enforce the rules of the game as they effect sportsmanship and acceptable conduct are to be supported by the coaches; therefore, coaches are to subscribe to this code in principle and action. Within the rules of each sport consequences follow unsportsmanlike conduct. It will be necessary for each coach and player to understand not only the rules of the game, but what constitutes acceptable behavior in that sport and the consequences of unacceptable behavior.

The following are examples of unacceptable behavior and are intended to be illustrative and not exhaustive. Although the consequences of enforcement of the rules are subject to review, it will be the expected outcome at SJND that the ejection of any player or coach from a contest will result in his/her ineligibility to play or coach in the following contest. The coach will enforce player ineligibility. The athletic director will enforce coach ineligibility. The taunting of opponents or exhibitions of "in your face" attitudes are not acceptable and should result in the removal of the player from the contest until the coach reasonably feels this action will not be repeated. Players called for technical fouls in basketball or yellow flags in soccer that are not ejected by the game's officials should be removed from the game by the coach immediately until "heels are cooled." The manner in which coaches explain and reprimand their players for unsportsmanlike behavior is important. The athletic director and/or principal will review any breach of sportsmanship that results in severe consequences, such as ejection from a game.

TRI COUNTY ATHLETIC LEAGUE
North Coast Section Ejection Policy

The following rules and minimum penalties are applicable to players as adopted by the North Coast Section (NCS) Board of Managers on April 21, 1995. This policy will be in effect beginning with the 1995-96 school year, (and will include non-league, league, invitational tournaments/events, post-season; league, and section or state playoffs, etc).

1. Ejection of a player from a contest for unsportsmanlike or dangerous conduct. Penalty: The player shall be ineligible for the next contest (non-league, league, invitational tournament/event, post season play whether it be league, section or state).
2. Illegal participation in the next contest by a player ejected in a previous contest. Penalty: The contest shall be forfeited and the player shall be ineligible for the next contest.
3. Second ejection of a player for unsportsmanlike or dangerous conduct from a contest during one season. Penalty: The player shall be ineligible for the remainder of the season.
4. When one or more players leave the bench (or dugout, etc.) to begin or participate in an altercation. Penalty: The player(s) shall be ejected from the contest-in- question-and become ineligible for the next contest, non-league, league, invitational tournament/event, post-season play including league, section, state playoffs (matches/events).

Appeals

Only appeals related to the factual situation of the player's ejection will be heard. Such appeals will only be made to penalties related to the subsequent penalties after the ejection, they will not have jurisdiction to change the status of the player's ejection from the game in question. No appeal will be heard related to official's judgment (other than an incorrect identification).

Appeals shall be heard initially through the ejected student's league, subsequent appeals may be made through the applicable North Coast Section, CIF and State CIF appeals procedure.

Notice: Every player and coach must read and sign a copy of the NCS Ejection Policy rule. The copies will be maintained by each school's administration. Each school's principal must send copies of the signed statement to the NCS office prior to the first contest of the season verifying that all players and coaches for the respective season (fall, winter, spring) have read and signed the NCS

Ejection Policy rule and that any further additions (either players or coaches) will also do so prior to participating in an inter-scholastic contest.

Signatures: I have read and understand the rules and regulations of the SJND code of conduct and the NCS Ejection Policy. Athletes may not participate in any contest until this document is filed with the school.
